#### Mayor's Message

#### Wild Weather & Busy Days in Conmee

What a bag of weather we've had this July! From tornado warnings and flooding to washedout roads, it's been anything but predictable. We've gone from drought to downpour in just days. I hope everyone is still finding time to enjoy their holidays and the camping season despite the chaos.

At the office, it's been a busy time with various government deadlines, grant applications for our departments, file updates, tax billing, and addressing residents' concerns. We continue working hard on matters that directly affect the Municipality.

#### **Designated Truck Route (DTR) Update**

Council is very much aware of the community's concerns surrounding the Designated Truck Route (DTR). Even though the City of Thunder Bay has voted to support the DTR, we've made it clear that doubling transport traffic through our community raises serious concerns. I've requested meetings with the Minister of Transportation in two ways—through a private meeting and as a deputation at the AMO Conference in August. For the deputation, we'll be going in as a united group with representatives from municipalities that share our concerns. Ultimately, the Province will have the final say, and we're doing our part to ensure they hear us loud and clear.

#### **Community Events & Volunteers**

The Social Committee will be seeking volunteers again in August to help plan fall events. These community gatherings are only possible with the support of volunteers. If you can lend a hand in any way, your help would be greatly appreciated.

#### Fire Department - Open House & Volunteer Drive

Our fire department will be hosting an open house soon. Like many volunteer-based services, we are always in need of more hands. If you want to give back to your community and be part of a dedicated team, consider joining Conmee Emergency Services.

All training, gear, and certifications are paid for—you just provide your time and commitment. Whether you're interested in firefighting, emergency first response (EFR), or both, we work around your schedule. Volunteers are asked to attend at least 50% of training sessions or calls. If you're interested, please contact the Fire Chief or call the municipal office for more information. #### Minutes were reviewed and approved: Clerk's Report :

June 25: All Food Cycler units had been picked up by residents, with a few additional residents expressing interest in purchasing remaining units. Fort Garry Fire Trucks agreed to extend the quote for the new pumper truck until August 22, 2025, noting that while the truck price is expected to remain stable, chassis pricing may fluctuate due to supply constraints. Twin City Industrial was contacted and is preparing a quote for a new pumper truck.

**July 8:** A formal letter was sent to the Minister of Transportation, the Premier of Ontario, and MPP Kevin Holland outlining the Township's concerns regard-

ing the proposed designated truck route. The updated landfill bylaw was posted to the Township website, and a pamphlet is being developed to inform users of recycling and disposal guidelines

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

June 25: The Township's auditor is working to complete the 2023 financial statements by June 30, 2025, to meet Infrastructure Ontario's financing deadline. If the deadline is missed, the Township would be required to submit 2024 financial statements, potentially delaying financing approval by several months. Council emphasized the importance of proceeding with the fire truck purchase to avoid cost increases and regulatory changes, including upcoming DEF (diesel exhaust fluid) requirements. Updates were provided on rink netting improvements. The Treasurer proposed using budgeted funds for overhead repairs and reimbursing the account if grant funding is received. July 8: The Treasurer reported that the 2023 financial audit was completed on June 29, with final journal entries and documentation in progress. Preparations for the 2024 audit are underway. The Infrastructure Ontario loan application was submitted, and the Treasurer thanked Council for their support in facilitating the process.

#### **Public Works Report:**

June 25: The Public Works Supervisor reported that calcium application was completed on several roads, with adjustments made to maximize coverage within budget. Repairs were made to a culvert on Hunt Road following heavy rainfall. Gravel hauling was completed on multiple roads, with 73 loads delivered over nine days. Signage updates were underway, including the purchase of new stop signs and check warning signs. Infrastructure funds were being used strategically to cover eligible road and culvert work. Concerns were raised about water misuse at the cemetery tank, and a new valve system was being considered to prevent waste. The Public Works Supervisor and Council discussed ongoing issues with frost heaving and unevenness at the food bank's loading dock. Several solutions were proposed, including replacing the existing asphalt with a concrete pad and using insulation to mitigate frost heave. The Clerk was directed to contact local concrete contractors for advice and quotes. The goal is to complete the work before winter.

#### Fire Chief's Report:

July 8: The Fire Chief joined the meeting virtually from Toronto. He advised that a written report would be submitted at the July 22 meeting. Chief Day thanked Councillor Kresack for assisting in locating a used pumper truck, which has already responded to two emergency calls. He discussed the department's ongoing operational needs, emphasizing the importance of acquiring a future tanker and the need for a standardized procurement process to ensure consistency and value in future equipment purchases.



#### **Landfill Use & Compliance Reminder**

The Township of Conmee reminds all residents of the importance of following proper procedures when using the landfill site at **573 Sovereign Road**. These rules help keep our landfill safe, efficient, and environmentally responsible.

#### **Landfill Access Cards Required**

All users must present a Landfill Access Card upon entry. Identification may be requested by the Landfill Attendant to confirm authorized use. If you need a card or replacement, please contact the Municipal Office.

#### Improper Disposal is a Problem

There have been ongoing issues with residents placing items in the wrong areas. To address this:

Loads may be inspected by the Landfill Attendant.

All waste must be sorted and placed in the correct designated areas.

Prohibited items (e.g., hazardous waste, shingles, medical waste) are not allowed.

Recyclables must be placed in the appropriate bins.

Please follow signage and the direction of the Landfill Attendant at all times.

#### **New: Fire Auxiliary Can Collection**

The Conmee Fire Auxiliary will be placing a can recycling bin at the landfill! The bin will be located in the recycling area; this bin supports fundraising efforts for our local fire services. Please deposit clean aluminum cans to help support this initiative.



#### **Township of Conmee Cemetery**

#### **Caring for Family Burial Plots in Conmee Cemetery:**

The Conmee Cemetery is a place of remembrance and respect. The Township is committed to preserving its dignity and beauty for generations to come. As families continue to honour their loved ones, we kindly remind residents of the shared responsibilities involved in the care and upkeep of family burial plots.

#### **Ways Families Can Help Maintain Burial Plots:**

Maintain Flowers and Decorations: Decorations such as flowers, shrubs, and borders are permitted.

Families are encouraged to care for their loved ones' plots by keeping flowers, shrubs, and decorations neat and well-tended and within the area of the plot. While these items are welcome, they must not interfere with grounds maintenance or pose safety concerns. If any item becomes overgrown, hazardous, or unsightly, it may be removed after consultation with the Interment Rights Holder. A tidy plot not only honours those laid to rest but also contributes to the overall beauty and serenity of the cemetery for all visitors.

<u>Installation of Borders and Monuments:</u> Borders must not be embedded in concrete, must be no higher than 8 inches, and must have an 8-inch\_sand path around them for maintenance. Monuments must be set on concrete bases at least 4 inches deep.

<u>Provide Notice for Interments</u>: Families must notify the Township Office at least 48 hours in advance of an interment, except in special circumstances (e.g., Coroner's request).

Supervise Children: Children under 12 must be accompanied by an adult while in the cemetery.

#### **How the Township Supports Cemetery Care:**

**Grounds Maintenance:** Regular upkeep of cemetery grounds, including mowing and general care.

<u>Cemetery Oversight:</u> The Cemetery Board, composed of the Mayor and Council, oversees cemetery operations and enforces the by-law.

**Record Keeping and Sales:** Administration staff manages lot sales, interment rights, and record keeping. Lots are available only to current or former Conmee residents.

<u>Care and Maintenance Fund:</u> Care and maintenance fees apply upon plot purchase. These fees are allocated to a trust fund to ensure long-term care of the cemetery.

<u>Water Supply Maintenance:</u> A new shut-off valve tap was recently installed to address a leak in the cemetery's water tank, helping to preserve water and maintain service for visitors. There is a resistance point in the mechanism. To turn the water on, <u>continue turning past it</u> to achieve full flow. Please use the tap rather than the lever.



#### Municipality Newsletters- August 2025 Edition

Taking care of the 10-15 metre buffer between lawn and lake, river, or stream can make all the difference to the health of the watershed. Native shrubs and <u>trees</u> root deep into the soil and hold the bank in place, stabilizing the water's edge against wave action and use by wildlife. These plants also help filter runoff that flows off our driveways and roofs and into our water systems.

If you're interested in adding native plants to the shoreline or streambank on your property, the Lakehead Region Conservation Authority (LRCA) may be able to help! 
