### 4. DEPUTATIONS

4.1 Conmee Non-Profit Housing Corporation (CNPHC)

4.1.1 AGI - Proposal of Services

A deputation was provided by Ms. Evans. The purpose of the deputation was to bring to Council's attention a funding opportunity through Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC)'s "Rapid Housing Initiative". A developer, Actiongroup Inc. (AGI), has prepared plans for construction of a two-story apartment building to

provide affordable housing units for seniors in Conmee. She provided an overview of the corporation, its work to date, and how this particular funding initiative would kick-start the development known as "Pines on Hume". The proposed development is eligible for funding under the CMHC "Rapid Housing" program which could provide funding for up to 100% of the construction costs. The "Rapid Housing" program is only available to municipalities and non-profit housing corporations. However, the program strongly favours municipalities which is why the CNPHC is asking the Township of Conmee to submitting the application, rather than the CNPHC. The Township would have to retain the land and building for at least 4 years - which would mean that the Township would not receive taxation revenue. However, the Township would have an income stream from the rental of the units. After 4 years, it could be sold to the private sector or a not-for-profit corporation such as CNPHC. Everything is "ready to go" for the application process: plans, schedule, budget, etc. AGI's fee to work with the Township is \$85,470.00 plus HST. For this fee, the Township obtains ownership of all of the plans, budgets etc. that form part of the application package. Additional fees would be necessary for additional units or amendments. Accordingly, if the application is not successful, the Township would be ready to re-apply in future intakes or for other programs, using these plans. AGI provided a full proposal document (10 pages), which was provided to Council for reference.

Mr. Holland, as the Former Chair of CNPHC, provided further background and information about the vision for the "Pines on Hume" property. As Mr. Holland was involved with the "Pines on Humes" property since its conception, he provided further details about the overall final vision for the property. The most current project designs and stylized drawings were presented to Council while Mr. Holland explained the reasonings and thoughts behind the various elements such as vegetable gardens and recreational trails.

A question was permitted from a resident who was present at the meeting. The resident inquired about the financial impact. Ms. Evans explained that the proposed development would not taxable but the rental income from the apartments would offset the loss of taxation.
